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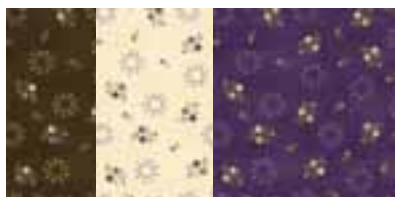

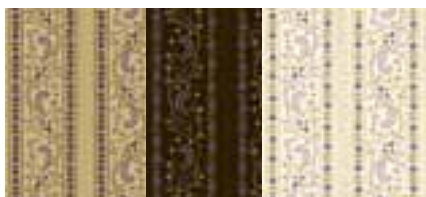

## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS FOR QUILT

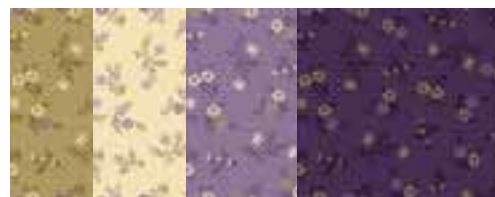
Fat quarters of four background fabrics  
Fat quarters of two lavender fabrics  
Fat quarters of two khaki fabrics  
Fat quarters five dark (brown & purple) fabrics  
1/2 yd 7215Y-50 for inner border and blocks  
2 yd 7206-38 for outer border (cut lengthwise)  
1/2 yd for binding  
3-1/2 yards for backing

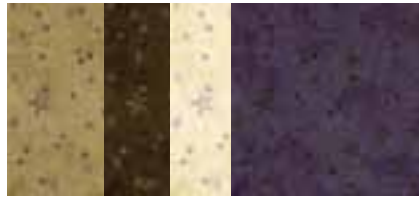

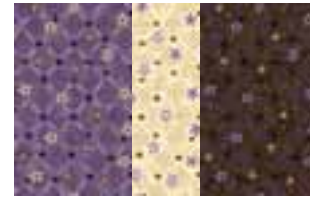

## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Fat quarters of four background fabrics

Fat quarters of two lavender fabrics

Fat quarters of two khaki fabrics

Fat quarters five dark (brown & purple) fabrics

1/2 yd 7215Y-50 for inner border and blocks

2 yd 7206-38 for outer border (cut lengthwise)

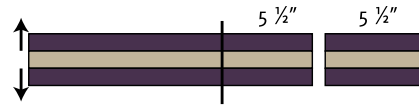
1/2 yd for binding

3-1/2 yards for backing

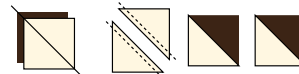
## BLOCK ASSEMBLY

STAR BLOCKS 10" finished, Make 10

Stitch a dark 1-3/8" x 17" strip lengthwise to each side of a light 1-1/4" x 17" strip. Make 14 strip sets. Cut the strip sets into (40) 5-1/2" segments. (Each will measure 3" x 5-1/2".)



For each star block, pair up two light and two dark 3-3/8" squares. Draw a line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the light squares. Place, right sides together, on the dark square. Sew 1/4" from each side of the line. Cut apart on the line. Press. This will yield four half square triangle blocks for the outer corners of the star block.



For each center star, use:

(4) 1-3/4" x 3" rectangles light fabric

(4) 1-3/4" squares light fabric

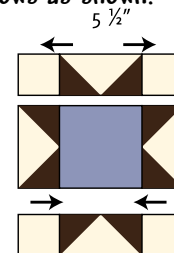
(8) 1-3/4" squares dark fabric

(1) 3" lavender square for center

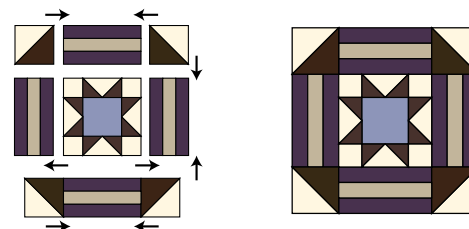
Draw a line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the dark 1-3/4" squares. Place a square, right sides together, on one end of the light 1-3/4" x 3" rectangle. Sew on the line, trim corner away and press. Repeat on the other end of the rectangle. This is a flying geese unit, make four for each block.



Sew a flying geese unit to each side of the 3" center square. Sew a 1-3/4" square light fabric to each end of the remaining two flying geese. Sew the block together in rows as shown.



Add a strip set to each side of the square. Sew a half square triangle to the ends of two strip sets. Sew to the top and bottom. Press in the direction of the arrows. Make 10 - 10" blocks.



Please read through instructions before beginning.

Seams are 1/4" - wof=width of fabric

It is helpful to place cut pieces into labeled baggies.

## CUTTING REQUIREMENTS

From inner border 7215Y-50 cut:

- (7) 1-1/2" x wof strips

From outer border 7206-38, cut (4) lengthwise strips. Cut each strip to the design is the same in each strip. This will allow the mitered corners to match.

- (2) 6" x 60" lengthwise strips
- (2) 6" x 70" lengthwise strips

\*Note: Fat Quarters are cut lengthwise 21" except for the strip sets which are cut crosswise 17".\*

From a variety of backgrounds, cut a total of:

- (10) 1-3/4" x 21" strips, subcut into (40) 1-3/4" x 3" rectangles and (40) 1-3/4" squares for star blocks
- (10) 3-3/8" x 21" strips, subcut into (60) 3-3/8" squares

From a variety of dark fabric, cut a total of:

- (7) 1-3/4" x 21" strips, subcut into (80) 1-3/4" squares for star points
- \*(28) 1-3/8" x 17" strips for star block strip sets
- (7) 3-3/8" x 21" strips, subcut into (40) 3-3/8" squares for alternate blocks

From Dark Brown fabric, cut a total of:

- (4) 3-3/8" x 21" strips, subcut into (20) 3-3/8" squares for alternate blocks

From khaki fabric, cut a total of:

- \*(14) 1-1/4" x 17" strips for star block strip sets
- (4) 3-3/8" x 21" strips, subcut into (20) 3-3/8" squares for alternate blocks

From lavender fabric, cut a total of:

- (7) 3-3/8" x 21" strips, subcut into (40) 3-3/8" squares for alternate blocks
- (10) 3" x 3" squares for star centers

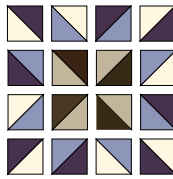
Binding

- (6) 2-1/2" x wof strips pieced end to end.

ALTERNATE BLOCKS 10" finished, Make 10

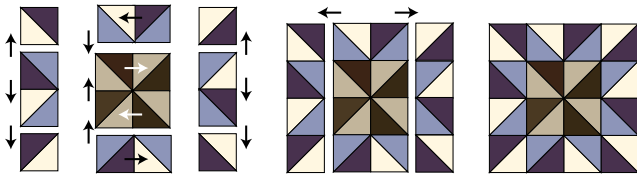
The block is 16 half square triangle units.  
For each block use 3-3/8" squares in this combination:

- (2) khaki squares paired with (2) dark brown squares for center pinwheel.
- (2) background squares paired with (2) lavender squares
- (2) background squares, paired with (2) dark squares
- (2) lavender squares paired with (2) dark squares.



Piece the half square triangles as you did for the star block.

Layout each block as shown and sew together in rows, pressing seams in the direction of the arrows.



QUILT ASSEMBLY

Assemble the quilt top in five rows of four alternating blocks. Sew the rows together, press seams in opposite directions for easier piecing.

BORDERS

Stitch 1-1/2" inner border strips end to end to make one long strip. Cut:

(2) 1-1/2" x 60" strips - top and bottom borders

(2) 1-1/2" x 70" strips - side borders

Sew inner border strips to matching outer border strip. Mark the center point of the side of the quilt and the center point of the border strip. Pin the border to the quilt top, matching the center points. Stitch, start and stop 1/4" from each end of the quilt top, backstitch to secure the threads. Sew the top and bottom border strips in the same manner. Miter the corners.

Layer, quilt and bind.
